From Our Pastor:

Well here we are at the start of another season of the church year - Lent. I have found that I rather appreciate Lent, even with its penitential and somber mood. I appreciate it because it is the time of the year in the church calendar that we “get real.” It is the time of the church year that we are asked, encouraged to take a good, honest look at ourselves and admit that we fall short of what God would want of us.

I believe that most of us long to hear this truth. It’s a relief to be in a place where it’s safe to drop the suffocating pretense that everything’s just fine. In our death-denying, youth promoting, beauty-idolizing and success oriented culture, it’s strangely comforting to me to face the fact that I am mortal, that I am less than perfect, that I am in fact a sinner. That’s not a popular concept in today’s world. And yet life seems a lot less chaotic when we simply name sin as sin, whether we’re talking about the individual and social sins we witness around us, in all their guises and disguises, or the personal sins that trigger shame and that regularly trip us up. Lent is the time to get real.

But Lent also is about hope. It is about “good news,” THE good news. For it is during this season that we cling to hope, the hope that is embodied in Christ, “the one who was handed over to death and raised for our justification.” Just how and why his death accomplishes this is a bit of a mystery, but what we experience is not. Through his death and resurrection we experience the freeing feeling of being forgiven; we experience the empowering reality of new life; we experience the transformative power of the Holy Spirit. The resurrection, the Easter story, makes all things new and continues to make all things new for us.

It is my prayer that this Lent is a time that we as a congregation are able to “get real” and cling to the hope of the new life we have in Christ. Hallelujah, praise the Lord!
