## From Our Pastor:

We were at a party recently that had a piñata. Not one of the ones they use today where you pull strings until one opens the magic hole, the good old fashioned kind that you swing at with a bat! Of course we had blindfolds on, but there was an extra challenge ... the piñata was on a rope that ran through a branch high up in the tree. My husband was holding the other end of the rope. Once you lined up your bat with the piñata, there was no telling if he would move it so that it wasn't there when you swung at it. More than one of us took a mighty swing only to spin around helplessly missing everything! We laughed at how foolish we looked out there, in the front yard of my mother-in-law's house, swinging hopefully at this moving target.

We hear a lot about today about the decline of mainline churches. We hear about people being spiritual but not religious, about a general loss of interest in or even need for the church or organized religion. We see and probably experience how people have drifted from at least a loose connection to a church to no need at all for such a connection.

All of this helps me to understand Paul's statement to the Corinthians, "For the message about the cross is *foolishness* to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the *power* of God... For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength" (1 Corinthians 1:18, 25, emphasis mine). "In Paul's time, the Jews were having a hard time understanding how the Messiah, their supposed Savior, could end up dying like a common criminal on a cross. Surely this was a sign of defeat not of victory. Surely this demonstrated God's weakness not his power and strength. God's ways sometimes appear like foolishness in light of the world's way of measuring things.

I understand Paul's statement because I still believe that in Jesus' death sin has been defeated and in his resurrection we are given new life. I believe that the church always has been and continues to be a place where the gathered community can experience a fulfilling, meaningful life of worship, study, fellowship and prayer. I believe the church can make a difference in our communities and nations. And so I carry on with you and others of faith who hold to the reality of "Christ has died. Christ has risen. Christ will come again." Through it all God is always more faithful than we are, and so we should hold to God's word.

## Always Being Made New Campaign

The ELCA is in the middle of a five year fundraising campaign called *Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA*. ## 2015 Synod Assembly Reflections

St. John Lutheran Church in Farmington Hills did a very nice job of hosting this year's Synod Assembly on May 15 and 16. They provided Friday's dinner and Saturday's breakfast and lunch. All the food was very good.

Representing our church was Pastor Jackie Rau, Dale Charneski, and Christina Wardell. We elected Synod Officers, Synod Council, Discipline Committee, Consultation Committee, and 2016 Churchwide Assembly voting members. Pastor Jackie was elected for a three year term to the Synod Council representing Conference #11.

The theme for this year's Synod Assembly was "Rise Up Together - For The Sake Of The World", and a Glocal Mission Festival preceded the 'business' sessions of the assembly.

Glocal Mission gatherings are designed to help participants gain practical skills for mission, engage in the current intersections of local and global mission, and discover how changes in the world are transforming the way churches like the ELCA proclaim and serve.

There were two major presentations, one on Accompaniment and the second on World Hunger. There were also five workshops which dealt with both local and global ("Glocal") topics:

---"Sawhorse Build 101" – participants assembled sawhorses for the upcoming Youth Gathering (nearly 300 are needed!)

---"Engaging One Another in Mission to Become a Multicultural Church"

---"Music and Mission" – led by the very talented Glocal musicians

---"World Hunger"

---"The Gospel of Water & Detroit's Shutoff Struggle in an Age of Water Wars"

The ELCA Glocal musicians provided international music throughout the 2 days and led the worship services. They led us in sing-a-longs in several languages, with the words appearing on a screen behind them in the sanctuary. We had a full worship service on Saturday afternoon with a round loaf of bread for communion and gluten-free wafers available for those with allergies. The free-will worship offering totaled \$2,209.50 and will be divided between our companion synods: Tanzania's Mbulu Diocese and the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land (ELCJHL).

Rev. Sunitha Mortha spoke about culture and diversity. She mentioned that what we see when we notice other cultures is like the tip of the iceberg. There is so much more under the water. She herself, being from India, asked her father about marrying for love instead of an arranged marriage, as is the custom there. Her father asked her if she had chosen her family. She of course, answered "No". Then he asked if she loved her family, to which she answered "Yes". In the same way those in an arranged marriage grow to love one another. Arranged marriages are good for the community rather than individual. Other countries see our movies and think we have no modesty, but Rev. Sunitha, when working with our youth in this country, noticed we told them to cover their cleavage and their belly buttons. In India, they cover themselves with many layers of cloth, but often leave their belly buttons exposed.

Rev. Ronald Bonner, Sr., pastor at Church of the Atonement in Atlanta, Georgia and a member of the ELCA Global Mission Team, spoke on Friday evening about world hunger and that many people are "on the wrong side of capitalism". He mentioned there are people in South America who pick cotton for only \$2/day and others who work on oil rigs for \$3/day, so that we can get our cotton/polyester clothes in our department stores. He said he thinks about people in other parts of the world suffering when he eats his seedless grapes.

I don't know what the cost of living is in other countries, but I agree no one should have to starve. That is one reason I believe in the work Church

World Services does and support the CROP Walk every year.

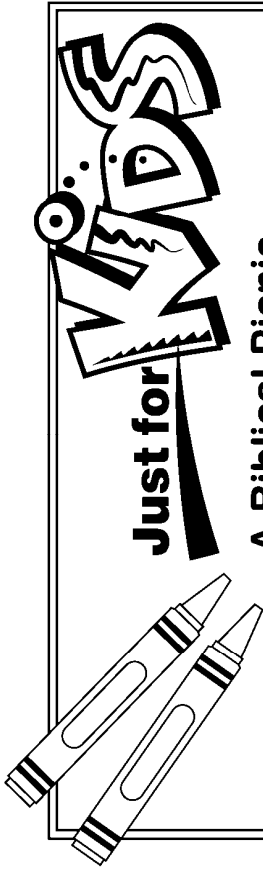
